- The exact catalogue of content offered differs from country to country.
- Netflix began life in the USA as a DVD ordering service, similar to Love Film in the UK. In the UK, Netflix is an online-only service.
- As well as offering popular and niche television and film content, in 2011 Netflix began commissioning
 and creating their own 'original programming'. This has included critically-acclaimed political drama,
 House of Cards, a new series of cult comedy Arrested Development and prison drama Orange Is The New
 Black.
